

## **The Malayan Communist Party and the Indonesian Communist Party: Concrete Features of their Co-operation**

With regard to the relations between the Malayan Communist Party (MCP. Founded in 1930) and the Indonesian Communist Party (Partai Komunis Indonesia. PKI. Founded in 1920), only guiding role played by the PKI leaders in the leftist movements in Malaya during the early 1920s have so far been analyzed. In this article, the author tries to depict the co-operation between the two Parties in various fields as below.

### **I. Mutual support prior to the declaration of the Emergency (1948).**

1. Sutan Djenain of the PKI and the Kesatuan Melayu Muda (Young Malay Union)
2. The MCP and the PKI immediately after the end of the Second World War.

### **II. Unknown activities of the MCP members in Indonesia.**

1. Until the establishment of the Representative Office of the Malayan National Liberation League in Jakarta.
2. Overt activities of the Representative Office.
3. Covert activities after closure of the Representative Office.
