

Supporting Chinese royalists from overseas Chinese in

Yokohama, Japan(1898—1911)

Chinese royalists set up two overseas schools in Yokohama and Tokyo with the direct support of Yokohama overseas Chinese, which fostered specialists for themselves and Yokohama overseas Chinese, achieving two things at one stroke.

Yokohama overseas Chinese often provided the funds for Chinese royalists' activities, which was the most direct, most important, most effective and the easiest supporting way to be accepted, and also was the main reason why Chinese royalists tried hard to get round Yokohama overseas Chinese.

At the beginning of their exiling in Japan, Chinese royalists were dependent on the Yokohama Overseas Chinese help in politics or in life on account of not knowing Japanese and their political identity of the fugitive. That help was an important material foundation for their survival and development in Japan. The support of overseas Chinese to the royalists mainly consisted in three ways: providing the venue, information and human resources.

The support of Yokohama Overseas Chinese to Chinese royalist played a huge role in the promotion of their ideas and activities, meanwhile, had a significant impact on China's social ideological position and domestic political situation objectively.
