

## **Integration-Retrospection-Interaction**

### **——A Study on the Transnational Relations of New Chinese Immigrants in Japan**

Based on the transnational relation theory in international relations studies with a focuses on the new Chinese immigrants in Japan, this article is an exploration of the state and development trends of the relations between emigrants and nation states in the background of nationalism and transnationalism clashing against each other, and to what extent do their psychological identity and feelings toward nation-state convey the contemporary information and personal pursuit. From three dimensions known as “integration”, “retrospection”and “interaction”, the whole article would elaborate on the different mentality, choice behavior and movement process of the new Chinese migrates with regard to their relations with residence country, ancestral homeland and bilateral interaction. The article argues that as one of the transnational actors who are independent from the control of nation state ( original homeland ) in the era of globalization, the behavioral objectives, relation forming tendencies and interest seeking of the new Chinese migrants, reflect a fact that national interests and regional security have actually re-agglomerated emigrant community and nation state. Moreover, the re- agglomeration has been carried to a new stage that both mutual friendship between nation states and regional stability have demanded the support of transnational actors.
