

The developments and problems of the Filipino-Chinese organizations at the turn of the century.

This paper includes: the developments of the Filipino-Chinese organizations since 1990s, the current situations, problems and future. In 1990s, the international relations were easing up, the assimilation between Philippines and overseas Chinese was further developing, so that FFCCCII (the Federation of the Filipino-Chinese Chambers of Commerce and Industry, Inc.) changed its political orientation in the middle of 1990s and arose the fundamental change in the Filipino-Chinese community. In this period, the interior conflicts in both FFCCCII and the community were furious, after FFCCCII's splits, thus forming the current situation: there are a lot of organizations in the Filipino-Chinese community, and 3 top leading organizations are tripartite confrontation. The top three are PCGCC(Philippine Chinese General Chamber of Commerce) and FFCCCII, CFBCI (Chinese Filipino Business Club, Inc.), a comparative study will be carried out among the three influential organizations to show the current situations of the power structure and some problems the Filipino-Chinese community is facing.
